Tyntesfield Audit Monday 21 November 2016

Many thanks to Judith, Roy and John who turned out on what proved to be one of the wettest days of the year! As a result we concentrated on the grassland fungi, especially the Waxcaps (W) on the various lawns. Despite the weather, we saw a good display on both the South Lawns and in Paradise. *Hygrocybe coccinea* was well represented, as were two unusual species of Clavulinopsis (*C. laeticolor* and *C. luteoalba*). As in all the Audits, a full list of the distribution of the species found has been recorded.

Tyntesfield has two BAP species: *Microglossum olivaceum* (the Olive Earth Tongue) and *Entoloma madidum*. No fruitbodies of *Entoloma madidum* were found (it has not been seen since 2014), but there was a magnificent display of Earth Tongues, with many hundreds present in a very small area.
