A beautiful day, good company and lots of perfect flowers, BUT very few fungi. The continuing cool and very dry spring was clearly to blame. The one species of note was found in the Quarry – *Parasola kuehneri*, a species that looks like several other species of *Parasola*, but is readily identified by its small heart-shaped spores. In the 10 or more years that we have visited Tyntesfield this is the lowest number of species ever recorded.
